REPORT:

We started the year with a mix of old and new players from the year before and a player or two new to the game. Along came grading day and we fell short of expectations to grade in the B's and secured a spot in the C grade for the season. There was work to be done to get them working together as team and much to learn.

Training commenced with a focus on working out who played what position best, which combination worked best, and what positions best suited each player. The first couple of weeks we clunked through the games managing to win each one.

They worked on holding their positions on the court and feeding the goal shooters to get closer into the goal post. A level above the teams they were playing against.
